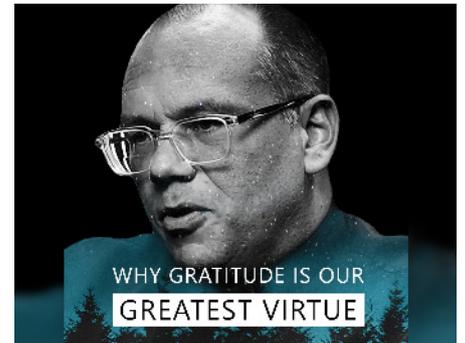
## Made For Glory

# Word on Fire Institute

Catholic in America's Special Guests

One of the strengths of the Catholic in America show format is found in its modularity. One episode may be a discussion between 3 priests about demons or purgatory, while the next episode may feature a one-on-one interview with a highly revered expert from around the country. Recently, Father Michael sat down with two guests from the Word on Fire Institute, Dr. Christopher Kaczor and Dr. Holly Ordway, to discuss their recently authored books.

Dr. Christopher Kaczor is Professor of Philosophy at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, and earned his PhD at Notre Dame. In his book, "Jordan Peterson, God, and Christianity", Dr. Kaczor explores Jordan Peterson's understanding of the book of Genesis, his view of religion in society, and his so-called "12 Rules for Life". Many Christians often wonder whether Jordan Peterson's teachings are

compatible with the Catholic faith, as Dr. Peterson avoids defining his religious beliefs, but rather describes himself as a person "who acts as if God exists, and is terrified that He might". In the interview, Dr. Kaczor explains Peterson's sense of religion, universal lessons we can extract from the Old Testament, as well as Dr. Kaczor's own faith journey.

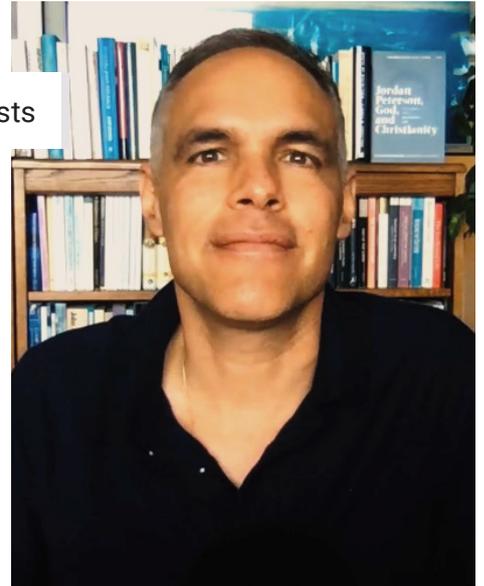
