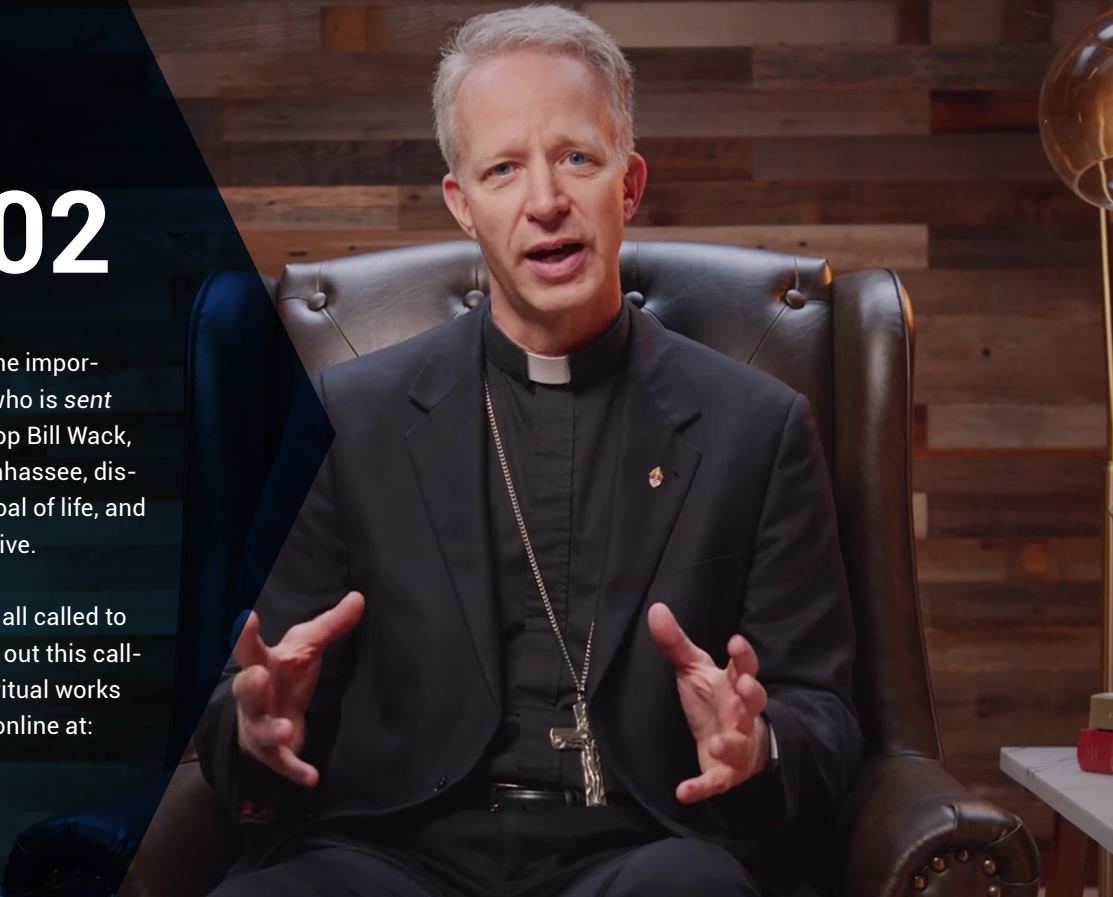


SENT Series 02

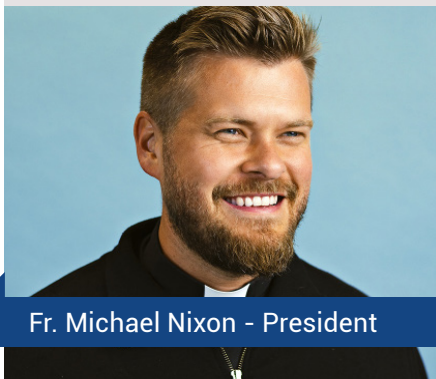
